2 **Creation of a State Debt - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2002**
 3 **and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 1991, 1992, 1994, 1995,**
 4 **1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, and 2001**

5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~Seven~~
 6 ~~Hundred Twenty Two Million, One Hundred Ninety Four Thousand Dollars~~
 7 ~~(\$722,194,000)~~ Seven Hundred Thirty-One Million, Fifty-Eight Thousand
 8 Dollars (\$731,058,000) the proceeds to be used for certain necessary building,
 9 construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and
 10 capital equipment purchases of this State, for acquiring certain real estate in
 11 connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other
 12 organizations for certain purposes, subject to the requirement that certain
 13 grantees provide certain matching funds of a certain type by a certain date;
 14 providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan;
 15 providing for certain unexpended appropriations in prior capital budgets and
 16 bond loan acts to be expended for other public projects; altering certain
 17 requirements for certain programs in prior capital budget acts; *requiring certain*
 18 *grantees to grant and convey a certain easement to the Maryland Historical*
 19 *Trust; making a technical correction;* providing that the authorizations of State
 20 Debt in certain prior capital budgets and bond loan acts be reduced by certain
 21 amounts; providing for certain additional information to be detailed about each
 22 project in the capital program; and generally relating to the financing of certain
 23 capital projects.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:

(1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2002 in the total principal amount of ~~\$722,194,000~~ \$731,058,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117 through 8-124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the Code.

(2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

(3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable architects' and engineers' fees:
