## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Creation of a State Debt - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of**

6 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~Seven~~  
 7 ~~Hundred Twenty Two Million, Four Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars~~  
 8 ~~(\$722,470,000)~~ Seven Hundred Forty-Two Million, Four Hundred Sixty-Nine  
 9 Thousand Dollars (\$742,469,000) the proceeds to be used for certain necessary  
 10 building, construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion,  
 11 replacement, and capital equipment purchases of this State, for acquiring  
 12 certain real estate in connection therewith, and for grants to certain  
 13 subdivisions and other organizations for certain purposes, subject to the  
 14 requirement that certain grantees provide certain matching funds of a certain  
 15 type by a certain date; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds  
 16 evidencing the loan; providing for certain unexpended appropriations in prior  
 17 capital budgets and bond loan acts to be expended for other public projects;  
 18 altering certain requirements for certain programs in prior capital budget acts;  
 19 providing that the authorizations of State Debt in certain prior capital budgets  
 20 and bond loan acts be reduced by certain amounts; providing for certain  
 21 additional information to be detailed about each project in the capital program;

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
16 MARYLAND, That:

17 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on  
18 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland  
19 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2003 in the total principal amount of ~~\$722,470,000~~  
20 \$742,469,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State  
21 general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and  
22 issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117 through 8-124 of the  
23 State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the Code.

24 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as  
25 a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement  
26 Article.

27 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer  
28 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and  
29 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then  
30 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the  
31 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable
