(5) Prior to the payment of any funds under the provisions of this Act for the purposes set forth in Section 1(3) above, the grantee shall provide and expend a matching fund. No part of the grantee's matching fund may be provided, either directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. No part of the fund may consist of real [property,] PROPERTY OR in kind [contributions, or] CONTRIBUTIONS. THE FUND MAY CONSIST OF funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act. In case of any dispute as to the amount of the matching fund or what money or assets may qualify as matching funds, the Board of Public Works shall determine the matter and the Board's decision is final. The grantee has until June 1, [2003] 2005, to present evidence satisfactory to the Board of Public Works that a matching fund will be provided. If satisfactory evidence is presented, the Board shall certify this fact and the amount of the matching fund to the State Treasurer, and the proceeds of the loan equal to the amount of the matching fund shall be expended for the purposes provided in this Act. Any amount of the loan in excess of the amount of the matching fund certified by the Board of Public Works shall be canceled and be of no further effect.

**Explanation:** This language changes a prior authorization for the use of general obligation bond funds to modify the project name and location.

[(b)] (II) [\$5,000,000 shall be] \$2,500,000 for projects INITIALLY APPROVED BY THE HOUSE [as agreed upon by both houses].

(4) An annual State tax is imposed on all assessable property in the State in rate and amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds as and when due and until paid in full. The principal shall be discharged within 15 years after the date of issuance of the bonds.

(5) Prior to the payment of any matching grant funds under the provisions of Section 13(3) of this Act, the grantees shall provide and expend matching funds as specified in Section 13(3). No part of the grantee's matching fund may be provided, either directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. No part of the fund may consist of real property, in kind contributions, or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act. In case of any dispute as to the amount of the matching fund or what money or assets may qualify as matching funds, the Board of Public Works shall determine the matter and the Board's decision is final. The grantee has until June 1, 2006, to present evidence satisfactory to the Board of Public Works that a matching fund will be provided. If satisfactory evidence is presented, the Board shall certify this fact and the amount of the matching fund to the State Treasurer, and the proceeds of the loan equal to the amount of the matching fund shall be expended for the purposes provided in this Act. Any amount of

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the loan in excess of the amount of the matching fund certified by the Board of Public Works shall be canceled and be of no further effect.

(6) No portion of the proceeds of the loan or any of the matching funds may be used for the furtherance of sectarian religious instruction, or in connection with the design, acquisition, or construction of any building used or to be used as a place of sectarian religious worship or instruction, or in connection with any program or department of divinity for any religious denomination. Upon the request of the Board of Public Works, the grantee shall submit evidence satisfactory to the Board that none of the proceeds of the loan or any matching funds have been or are being used for a purpose prohibited by this Act.

(7) WHEN AN HISTORICAL EASEMENT IS SPECIFIED IN SECTION 13(3) OF THIS ACT:

(A) PRIOR TO THE ISSUANCE OF THE BONDS, THE GRANTEE SHALL GRANT AND CONVEY TO THE MARYLAND HISTORICAL TRUST A PERPETUAL PRESERVATION EASEMENT TO THE EXTENT OF ITS INTEREST:

(I) ON THE LAND OR SUCH PORTION OF THE LAND ACCEPTABLE TO THE TRUST; AND

(II) ON THE EXTERIOR AND INTERIOR, WHERE APPROPRIATE, OF THE HISTORIC STRUCTURES.

(B) IF THE GRANTEE OR BENEFICIARY OF THE GRANT HOLDS A LEASE ON THE LAND AND STRUCTURES, THE TRUST MAY ACCEPT AN EASEMENT ON THE LEASEHOLD INTEREST.

(C) THE EASEMENT MUST BE IN FORM AND SUBSTANCE ACCEPTABLE TO THE TRUST AND ANY LIENS OR ENCUMBRANCES AGAINST THE LAND OR THE STRUCTURES MUST BE ACCEPTABLE TO THE TRUST.

**Explanation:** The language specifies \$15.2 million in local projects initially approved by the Senate to be funded under the Legislative Community Initiatives Loan of 2004 that was pre-approved as part of the fiscal 2004 capital bill. The language leaves \$2.5 million available for local projects initially approved by the House. A different section of the fiscal 2004 capital bill has already pre-approved \$12.7 million in House-approved local projects.

Further, it should be noted that the funding of the Eastport Fire Station and Paramedic Unit is not intended to be contrary to long-standing State policy that responsibility for funding local fire stations is a local one. An exception is made for this particular fire station because it offers first response to

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the Annapolis State Government Complex. This exception is similar to the one made to the Annapolis Emergency Operations Center in the 2003 capital budget, again because that center serves the Annapolis State Government Complex.

**Explanation:** *The language specifies \$2.5 million in local projects initially approved by the House to be funded under the Legislative Community Initiatives Loan of 2004 that was pre-approved as part of the fiscal 2004 capital bill. A different section of the fiscal 2004 capital bill has already pre-approved \$12.7 million in House-approved local projects, bringing the total of House-approved projects to \$15.2 million. This equals the amount of projects added by the Senate. The language also clarifies that if a grant recipient receives multiple grants, those grants are in addition to one another. Any matching requirements, however, apply to each individual grant as provided for in the bill.*

- (b) ~~with the approval of the Board of Public Works, the Comptroller may advance funds to any loan fund account established pursuant to a general obligation bond loan enabling act, for which an approving legal opinion has been received by the Board, for any expenditure authorized by that act, provided that the next ensuing sale of general obligation bonds shall include the issuance of bonds under the authority of that act in an amount at least equivalent to the amount of funds so advanced.~~

the Comptroller may advance funds to any loan funds account established pursuant to a general obligation bond loan enabling act, for any expenditure authorized by that act, provided that if the general obligation bonds have not been issued under the authority of that act, the next ensuing sale of general obligation bonds shall include the issuance of bonds under the authority of that act in an amount at least equivalent to the amount of funds so advanced.

**Explanation:** This language strikes and replaces Section 11 in its entirety so that it is consistent with legislation enacted in the 2003 Session concerning the change from a project based to a cash based accounting system with regards to the use of general obligation bond loan proceeds.
