A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Creation of a State Debt - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of**

5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~Eight~~
 6 ~~Hundred Six Million, Seven Hundred Ninety Nine Thousand Dollars~~
 7 ~~(\$806,799,000)~~ Eight Hundred Seventeen Million, Three Hundred Seventy-Five
 8 Thousand Dollars (\$817,375,000), the proceeds to be used, subject to certain
 9 restrictions, for certain necessary building, construction, demolition, planning,
 10 renovation, conversion, replacement, and capital equipment purchases of this
 11 State, for acquiring certain real estate in connection therewith, and for grants to
 12 certain subdivisions and other organizations for certain development and
 13 improvement purposes, subject to the requirement that certain grantees provide
 14 and expend certain matching funds by certain dates; stating the intent of the
 15 General Assembly that funds be provided for certain projects for certain fiscal
 16 years; requiring the Interagency Committee on School Construction to allocate
 17 certain funds available for public school construction projects in a certain
 18 manner and to include certain funds in certain allocations; providing certain
 19 allocations made by the Interagency Committee are not subject to approval by
 20 the Board of Public Works; requiring that certain amounts approved for public
 21 school construction projects be allocated to certain counties; requiring that
 22 certain additional funds be provided to certain counties to be expended for
 23 certain public school construction projects subject to certain priority; providing
 24 that certain school construction funds may be applied to certain other projects or
 25 reverted to a certain fund under certain circumstances; authorizing the
 26 Interagency Committee to allocate certain additional funds in a certain manner
 27 after certain notice to the presiding officers of the General Assembly; providing
 28 generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loans; authorizing
 29 certain unexpended appropriations in certain prior capital budgets and bond
 30 loans to be expended for other public projects; altering certain requirements for
 31 certain programs in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans; providing that
 32 the authorizations of State Debt in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
15 MARYLAND, That:

16 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur
17 indebtedness on behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as
18 the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2007 in the total principal amount
19 of ~~\$806,799,000~~ \$817,375,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and
20 delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of
21 Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8–117
22 through 8–124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section
23 22 of the Code.

24 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be
25 sold as a single issue of bonds under Section 8–122 of the State Finance and
26 Procurement Article.

27 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the
28 Treasurer and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling,
29 and delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and
30 then shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by
31 the Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable
32 architects’ and engineers’ fees:

(4) Woodstock Equestrian Park. Provide a grant equal to the lesser of (i) \$250,000 or (ii) the amount of the matching fund provided, to the Board of Trustees of the Montgomery County Parks Foundation, Inc. for the planning, design, construction, and capital equipping of a public equestrian park, located in Beallsville, subject to a requirement that the grantee grant and convey a historic easement to the Maryland Historical Trust (Montgomery County).
