3 **and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002,**  
4 **2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, and 2007**5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~Eight~~  
6 ~~Hundred Seventy Two Million, Ninety Nine Thousand Dollars (\$872,099,000),~~  
7 Eight Hundred Eighty Six Million, Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$886,070,000),  
8 the proceeds to be used for certain necessary building, construction, demolition,  
9 planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and capital equipment  
10 purchases of this State, for acquiring certain real estate in connection  
11 therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other organizations for  
12 certain ~~development and improvement~~ purposes, subject to the requirement  
13 that certain grantees provide and expend certain matching funds by certain  
14 dates; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the  
15 loan; authorizing the creation of a State Debt to be issued in 2009, the proceeds  
16 to be used for certain purposes; stating the intent of the General Assembly that  
17 certain authorizations not constitute approval of any other project; providing  
18 that certain funds may not be expended until certain actions are taken and  
19 certain events occur relating to a certain grantee's capital project management,  
20 control, procedures, and staffing; requiring a certain institution of higher

36 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
 37 MARYLAND, That:

1 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on  
 2 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland  
 3 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2008 in the total principal amount of ~~\$872,000,000~~  
 4 \$886,070,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State  
 5 general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and  
 6 issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8–117 through 8–124 of the  
 7 State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the Code.

8 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold  
 9 as a single issue of bonds under Section 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement  
 10 Article.

11 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer  
 12 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and  
 13 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then  
 14 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the  
 15 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable

1 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly  
2 declares that it is the public policy of this State to manage State general obligation  
3 bond debt in a manner that will maintain Maryland's AAA bond rating. The General  
4 Assembly further declares that legislative oversight, control, and review of all forms of  
5 State obligations are essential to maintenance of the State's existing bond rating and  
6 protection of the fiscal integrity of the State.

7 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, before work may  
8 commence pursuant to any supplement to any appropriation contained in this Act,  
9 satisfactory evidence must be given to the Board of Public Works that the project can
