## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Creation of a State Debt – Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2009,**  
 3 **the Hillandale Center Loan of 2001, the Baltimore City – New Shiloh**  
 4 **Multipurpose Center Loan of 2001, and the Maryland Consolidated Capital**  
 5 **Bond Loans of 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, and 2008**

6 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~One~~  
 7 ~~Billion, Sixty Eight Million, One Hundred Twenty Four Thousand Dollars~~  
 8 ~~(\$1,068,124,000)~~ One Billion, One Hundred Eight Million, Four Hundred Sixty  
 9 Four Thousand, Two Hundred Thirty Five Dollars (\$1,108,464,235), the  
 10 proceeds to be used for certain necessary building, construction, demolition,  
 11 planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and capital equipment  
 12 purchases of this State, for acquiring certain real estate ~~in connection~~  
 13 ~~therewith,~~ and easements and for grants to certain subdivisions and other  
 14 organizations for certain development and improvement purposes, subject to the  
 15 requirement that certain grantees provide and expend certain matching funds  
 16 by certain dates; imposing a certain tax on all assessable property in the State;  
 17 providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan;  
 18 requiring certain grantees to grant a certain historical easement unless a  
 19 certain determination is made by the Maryland Historical Trust; providing that  
 20 the proceeds of certain loans must be expended or encumbered by a certain  
 21 date; providing that work may commence on certain projects prior to the  
 22 appropriation of all funds necessary to complete the project; providing that  
 23 certain funds allocated to certain eligible school construction projects in a  
 24 county that are not spent for the project may be applied to another eligible  
 25 project or reserved in a certain contingency fund for certain purposes; stating  
 26 the intent of the General Assembly that if certain funding is available for a  
 27 certain purpose, a certain upgrade shall be undertaken with the available  
 28 funding and certain funds shall be placed in a certain fund; prohibiting the

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
2 MARYLAND, That:

3 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on  
4 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland  
5 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2009 in the total principal amount of  
6 ~~\$1,068,124,000~~ \$1,108,464,235. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and  
7 delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of  
8 Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8-117 through 8-  
9 124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, § 22 of the Code.

10 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold  
11 as a single issue of bonds under § 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

12 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer  
13 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and  
14 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then  
15 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the  
16 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable

1 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly
